Two types of Ibadah

Preview

Ibadah means worshipping Allah. It includes everything we do to please Allah, either in prayers or in daily life — as long as we do it with the right intention. Let's delve deeper into this concept.

Ibadah Mahdhah (Pure Worship)



These are special acts of worship that only belong to Allah and must be done exactly how Allah and the Prophet Muhammad ﷺ taught us.

Example:

- Praying 5 times a day (Sholat)
- Reading the Qur'an
- Fasting in Ramadan

Ibadah Ghairu Mahdhah (General or Indirect Worship)



These are everyday actions that can become worship if we do them with the intention to please Allah.

Example:

- Studying and doing your homework
- Taking care of animals or plants
- Saying kind words to others

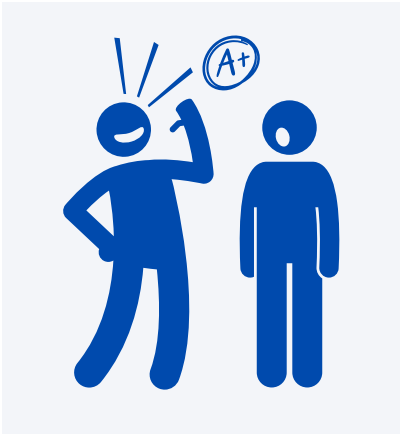
